Unions call for 'moment of reflection' for peace in Palestine

June 4th marks UN Day of Innocent Children Victims of Aggression

Over the last eighteen months, Israel's brutal assault on Gaza has resulted in the deaths of more than 15,000 children and injuries to 34,000.

In light of this ongoing tragedy, the Irish Congress of Trade Unions is now calling on workers across the island of Ireland to observe a moment of reflection on **Wednesday**, **June 4th**, marking the International UN Day of Innocent Children Victims of Aggression.

At 1:05pm on Wednesday 4th June, workers will be encouraged to stand together in their workplaces for a moment of respectful reflection, as a simple act of solidarity and remembrance for the loss of life and violations of international law

In response to widespread requests from trade union members for a shared moment of communal grief, Congress is inviting all workers—along with their families, colleagues, neighbours and employers—to remember these victims.

This initiative is not a work stoppage, and employers are being asked to support this solemn commemoration.
